
Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)

- LIHEAP is a federally funded program designed to help qualified low income families in lowa by providing a one-time payment to their heating utility. Other program components include crisis funding to assist in avoiding disconnection and weatherization funding.
- As a federally funded initiative, the program is managed by the lowa Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) and delivered through a decentralized network of local, nonprofit community action agencies (CAAs).
- Beyond LIHEAP, under lowa law, utilities are also required to operate a fund that allows its
 customers to voluntarily contribute money for deposit in a low-income heating assistance fund.
 Although these fund programs go by different names (Project Share, I CARE, etc.), they all assist
 low-income lowans with paying energy bills and weatherization costs for their homes.


LIHEAP FY2024 State Profile







The Other category consists of: Carryover to FY2025 (\$1,930,811) Assurance 16 Activities (\$300,055)

Types of Assistance

Heating Assistance served 82,693 households with reported average benefits of \$466.

Year-Round Crisis Assistance served 12,699 households with reported average benefits of \$315.

Weatherization Assistance served 977 households with a calculated average benefit of \$8,878.

LIHEAP in Iowa

Key Program Dates

August

HHS sends eligibility letters to qualifying families.

October 1

Early applications open for households with elderly (60+) or disabled residents

November 1 to April 1

Winter Moratorium in effect. Utilities cannot disconnect heating service for LIHEAP-qualified households.

November 1 to April 30

General application period for all other households.

Eligibility

Determined primarily by household income: 200% of the federal poverty level.

Application Process

- Customer is responsible for providing notification of the application to the utility. Utility gives 30 days for approval to be received before taking any disconnection action, if warranted.
- Applications can be submitted online, via postal mail, or in person at the CAA.
- There are a number of documentation requirements, including proof of SSN, income, and utility account(s).

Payment Process

CAA notifies the utility of approval and pledges payment.



LIHEAP in Iowa

Funding Year 2025

- Total funding: \$52.7M
- Last year the State moved to a new system for processing applications and has improved its funding timing and coordination for this upcoming moratorium season.

Funding Year 2026

- Federal funding allocations for this year are still under review. Both the Senate and the House have presented bills that would increase total funding
- IUC staff is actively working with Iowa HHS staff to monitor funding updates and plans to provide increased coordination, if needed, to ensure service for at-risk Iowans
